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Introduction

Established in the year 2002 by the Youth Corps Act No. 21 of 2002, the National Youth Corps initially functioned under the Ministries of Policy Planning and Implementation. From time to time, the Youth Corps came under several Ministries and in the year 2019, the Youth Corps functioned under the following Ministries.

- ▶ Ministry of National Policies, Economic Affairs, Resettlement and Rehabilitation, Northern Province Development, Vocational Training and Skills Development and Youth Affairs January - December
- ▶ Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs December

National Youth Corps is a non-military organization for youth. It targets school leavers and youth who have missed their higher education opportunities to develop their skills, knowledge and attitudes while developing their discipline, leadership, and personality to make them active contributors to national development. With this objective in mind, the youth corps provides a six-month full-time in-class and out-of-school training to school leavers between the ages of 16 and 28 in two phases per year through a network of training centres island-wide under a syllabus that suits them.

Impart competencies to transform youth into a healthy, multi-disciplinary, self-reliant generation.

National Youth Corps Council and Staff

Youth Corps Council

Preparation of plans and programs for the youth corps, regulating the implementation of such programs, overseeing the training of trainees, specifying the conditions relevant to the training and efficiency of the trainees in consultation with the director and specifying the extent of skills to be acquired by the trainees. The Minister in charge of the Youth Corps has appointed the council consisting of five members with a chairman, who are having expert knowledge on youth development, employment and education. This council consists of a representative from the general treasury.

Following the appointment of the new Government in December 2018, the Youth Corps Council was appointed for the Youth Corps in July 2019. This Council commenced its operation on 18 th July 2019 and was active only until November 2019. The council was as follows.

Subsequently, the appointment of the new Government in November 2019, the above officers who had previously served in the youth corps council resigned and no new officers were appointed to the youth corps council for the remainder of 2019.

National Youth Corps Staff

National Youth Corps consists of a Management Services Department-approved cadre including a director. The carder consists of permanent and contract employees. The Director is appointed by the Minister in charge of the subject and the recruitment for other posts is done under the recruitment procedures approved by the Management Services Department.

The contract staff included here are simply recruits who have legally retired or retired from the Armed Forces.

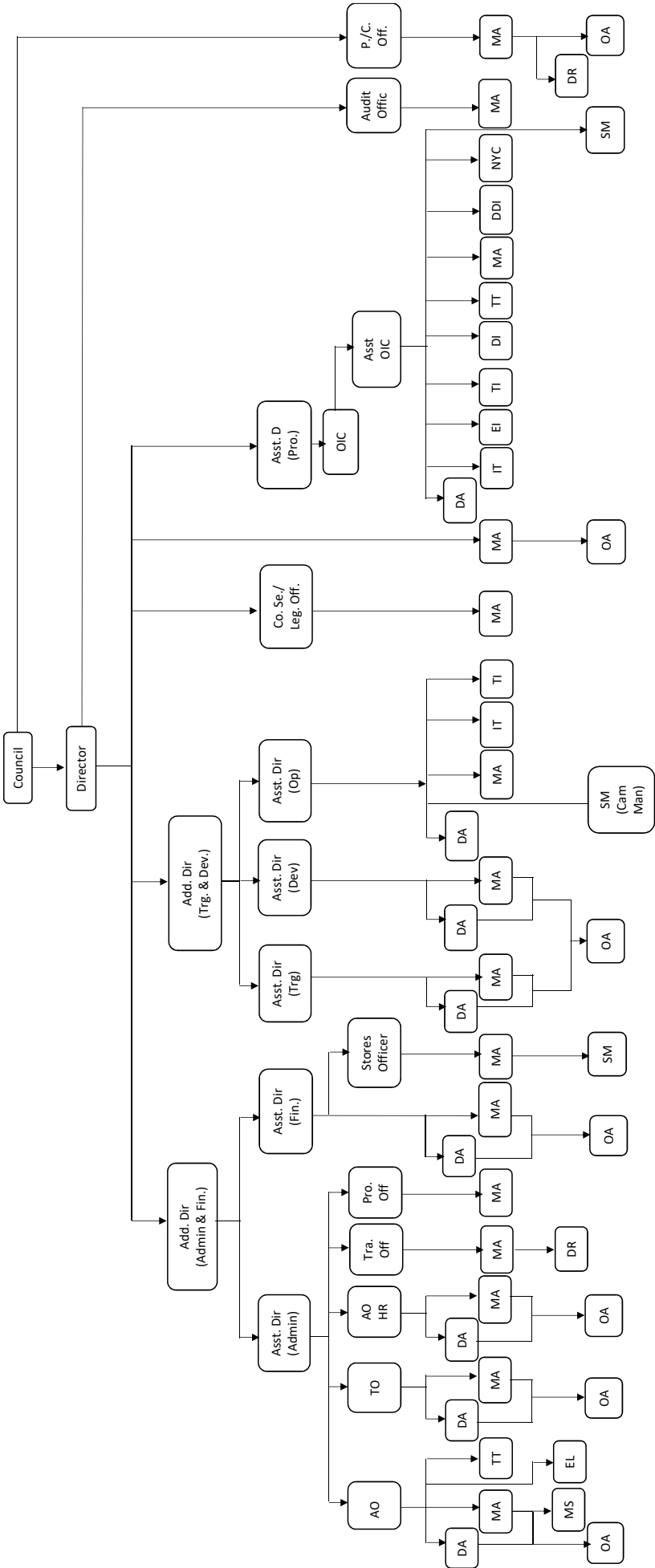

Institutional Structure of the National Youth Corps

The Youth Corps has a Headquarters Office, 09 Provincial Offices, 48 Training Centers, an Outdoor Training Center, a Hotel Training School, and a Business External Training Institute (IBPO). The Youth Corps Headquarters consists of the Director, 02 Additional Directors, 05 Assistant Directors and staff including the Secretary / Legal Officer. In addition, 02 posts have been approved for the National Youth Corps Headquarters in the year 2016 as Additional Directors (Planning) and Assistant Directors (Planning) for 03 years temporarily. Accordingly, the operational divisions of the Youth Corps Headquarters are as follows.

The following divisions are functioning under the Additional Director (Administration and Finance).

Administration Division - Assistant Director (Administration)

A Human Resource Unit, a Procurement Unit, a Transport Unit and a Construction and Maintenance Unit are functioning under the Assistant Director (Administration) and the staff including the Administrative Officer, Technical Officer and Chief Management Assistant provide their services. The main functions of this division are to facilitate the training course including human resource development activities including staff approval, recruitment, transfers, and infrastructure development at the Headquarters and Training Centers.

Finance Division - Assistant Director (Finance)

An Accounts Unit, a Financial Unit and a Storage Unit are functioning under the Assistant Director (Finance) and the staff including the Storage Officer provide their services for this purpose. The main functions of this division are to maintain all the storage activities including all payments including staff salaries and allowances, maintenance of all documents related to accounting activities and preparation of annual accounts and distribution of required inventory to the training centres.

The following divisions are functioning under the Additional Director (Training and Development)

Training Division - Assistant Director (Training)

Secretary / Legal Officer - Coordinating all the members of the council including assembling the youth corps council , presenting the council papers submitted by the respective divisions to the council, presenting the decisions taken by the council approved sheets to the relevant divisions and officers, taking notes of the council activities and all legal and judicial matters on behalf of the youth corps and the representation of the youth corps in such matters are carried out under the direct supervision of the director with the service of his staff.

Development Division - Assistant Director (Development)

The Development Division is functioning under the Assistant Director (Development) and the staff including the Supervising Officer is providing their services. The main functions of this division are to recruit trainees to the training centres, to organize various programs such as arts festivals, sports festivals, knowledge measurement competitions, community hospitality programs during the training period, graduation activities of the trainees and issuance of certificates.

Operations Division - Assistant Director (Operations)

The IT and Media Units are functioning under the Assistant Director (Operations) and the staff including the Supervising Officer is providing their services. The main functions of this division are to network and maintain the Headquarters and all the centres as a network, to update and maintain the Youth Corps website, to look into the IT needs of the Headquarters and Centers, and to meet all the media requirements of the Youth Corps.



The following divisions are functioning under the direct supervision of the Director of Youth Corps

Maintaining the activities of the Youth Corps Council

Secretary / Legal Officer - Coordinating all the members of the council including assembling the youth corps council , presenting the council papers submitted by the respective divisions to the council, presenting the decisions taken by the council approved sheets to the relevant divisions and officers, taking notes of the council activities and all legal and judicial matters on behalf of the youth corps and the representation of the youth corps in such matters are carried out under the direct supervision of the director with the service of his staff.

Internal Audit Division

The internal audit division is staffed by a staff under the direct supervision of the internal audit officer under the direct supervision of the youth corps director, who conducts audits at the national youth corps headquarters and all training centres and submits audit queries.`

National Youth Band

The National Youth Corps has a western band with all the modern band equipment and is recruited by the officers who have been recruited for the post of drill instructor in the youth corps after retiring as members of the armed forces bands. the band will be used for ceremonies including youth corps trainees' passing parades and will participate in the national independence day parade with the national youth corps trainees.



Human Resource Development

Various training programs are implemented to develop the knowledge and skills of the academic and non - academic staff of the national youth corps. Under this, a training policy has been formulated for the staff members to undergo training courses and according to that policy, the staff has been allowed to take training courses relevant to their respective roles according to their respective posts. The relevant course fee is Rs. 10, 000.00 to Rs. 75, 000.00 will be borne by the National Youth Corps.

In addition, the national youth corps staff will be directed to training programs conducted by staff training institutes such as the institute of development administration of sri lanka to develop and update their knowledge.

The National Youth Corps staff members who are selected based on opportunities such as scholarships will also be directed to foreign training programs, seminars etc. National Youth corps staff awareness and training workshops were conducted at the National youth corps headquarters as well as at the training centres with the participation of experienced resource persons in the respective fields. Accordingly, the National youth corps has focused more on human resource development.

Basic Training Course

The Youth Corps Basic Training Course is a six-month non-residential course designed to transform Sri Lankan youth who have dropped out of school and lost their higher education opportunities into disciplined, leadership, and capable individuals with knowledge, attitudes, and skills.

Admission to the course

Sri Lankan youth between the ages of 18 - 28 who have dropped out of school after completing their GCE (O / L) education can enter for this.

Benefits for trainees

- During the training, period provides Rs. 3, 000.00 monthly allowance
- Uniforms
- 24 hours coverage during the training period valuing Rs. 500, 000.00 Life Insurance
- After the basic training course, Referral to follow a vocational training course, and Giving a course fee of up to Rs. 10,000.00

National Youth Corps Hotel Training School

The National Youth Corps Hotel Training School has been established in the Inamaluwa area in Dambulla and this hotel training school conducts 04 courses in the hotel industry. These training courses are National Vocational Qualification (NVQ) Level III and IV courses, and this hotel training school can train up to 200 trainees at a time. The Hotel Training School is equipped with all the modern equipment required for a hotel training school as well as a competent advisory board in the qualified hotel industry. The training center will be funded by the Technology, Vocational Education and Training (TVET) 2014 - 2020 project.

Currently, only those who have completed the National Youth Corps Basic Training Course are admitted to the courses conducted by this training school. Courses are free of charge and trainees are provided with free meals during the training period. All trainees will be provided on-the-job training at reputed tourist hotels in Sri Lanka and all trainees who complete the course will be referred for employment in the hotel industry.

National Youth Corps Chinese Language Laboratory

A Chinese Language Laboratory was established in the year 2016 with the donations of the People's Republic of China with the aim of imparting the knowledge of the Chinese language to the Sri Lankan youth who are in great need of local and foreign employment opportunities at present.

Accordingly, this Chinese language laboratory was constructed for Rs. 2.5 million on the premises of the national youth corps hotel training school, dambulla and its training activities commenced on 2016. 07. 14 with the participation of the cultural affairs officer and the economic affairs adviser of the chinese embassy under the patronage of hon state minister of national policies and economic affairs. also, 60 trainees have the opportunity to learn the language in two phases per year and in the year 2017 , 163 trainees successfully completed the study of the chinese language.



National Youth Corps Business Process Outsource (BPO) Institute

This training center was established by the National Youth Corps with the objective of providing opportunities to the youth corps trainees for employment in the field of business process outsourcing which has a large number of employment opportunities in the local and foreign job market and this center is located at 355 / 3 / 1, Olcott Mawatha, Colombo 10, Installed in the building where the Institute for Technology Professionals is located. There are facilities to train 25 trainees in one phase. The training center will be funded by the Technology, Vocational Education and Training (TVET) 2014 - 2020 project.

The National Youth Corps has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with BCI in the United States to establish this training center, where trainees are required to sit for the examinations conducted online (online) by the BPO Certificate Institute, the India branch of BCI. Accordingly, trainees who complete the course will receive an internationally recognized certificate and all of them will be referred for employment.



Currently the following courses are conducted by this training center.

- Certified Customer Interaction Professional (CCIP)
- Certified Back Office Services Associate (CBSA)
- Certified Finance Process Associate (CFPA)

At present, only those who have completed the basic training course of the National Youth Corps are admitted to these courses and there is no charge for this course.

National Youth Corps Adventure Based Training (ABT) Centre

The Adventure Based Training Centre is located adjacent to the Naula Arangala A 9 road in the Matale District and conducts training courses for national youth corps trainees as well as staff and trainees of external institutions. This outreach training is also a mandatory part of the National Youth Corps Basic Training Course and focuses on developing soft skills in individuals.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements of the entity comprise the statement of financial position, statement of financial performance, statement of changes in net assets and statement of cash flow together with accounting policies and notes which have been prepared on accrual basis in accordance with the Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Sri Lanka.

Financial statements are prepared in Sri Lankan Rupees

Events Occurring subsequent to the balance sheet

All material events occurring after the balance sheet date have been considered in the financial Statements

Assets and Base of their valuation

The National Youth Corps was established under the Act No 21 of 2002 was under the purview the Ministry of National Policies & Economic Affairs.

National Youth Corps prepared financial statements from year 2015 onwards. Assets were revalued by the committee appointed by the Ministry of National Policies & Economic Affairs based on the recommendation of the council of NYC, as the value of the assets have not been previously accounted.

Buildings accommodated by the NYC have not been revalued, due to the title of those lands not being under NYC. The construction cost incurred from 2011 onwards has been depreciated at the rate of 5% since those constructions were based on capital funds released by the treasury. The vehicles are not belongs to NYC except three wheelers but all have been depreciated at the rate of 20%.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amounts or recognized as an asset, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the entity and the cost of the item could be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the statement of financial performance during the financial period in which they are incurred.

Depreciation

Depreciation on assets is calculated using straight-line method to allocate their cost or revalued amount over its estimated useful lives, as follows:

The depreciation on Property, Plant and Equipment begins from the year in which the assets were purchased or constructed and no depreciation is charged in the year of disposal.

Inventory

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value on the basis of FIFO.

Liabilities and Provisions

All known liabilities have been accounted in preparing the financial statements and adequate provision has been made for liabilities which are known to exist.

Retirement Gratuity

Provision is made in the financial statements for retiring gratuity which may fully due for payment, under the payment of gratuity act no 12 of 1983. Retirement benefit costs for all employees who have completed more than five years of continuous Service with NYC.

Deferred Income

Deferred income is shown in the performance report on a systematic basis over the lifetime of the capital investment assets

Auditor general's report on financial statements and other legal and regulatory requirements of the national youth corps for the last year, ending 31 st December 2019 in terms of section 12 of the national audit act no. 19 of 2018.

1. Financial Statements
- 1.1 Qualified Audit opinion

The national youth corps' financial statements declaration for 31 st December 2019 and the financial performance statement for the year ending on that day, the declaration of change of rights, the cash flow statement for the final year and the financial statements for the year ending 31 st December 2019 with summary important accounting policies financial statements were audited under my direction in accordance with the provisions of the national audit act no. 19 of 2018 and the finance act no. 38 of 1971 read in conjunction with article 154 (1) of the constitution of the democratic socialist republic of Sri Lanka. The report will be tabled in parliament in due course in accordance with article 154 (6) of the constitution.

According to my opinion, Aside from the impact of the facts described in the base section for the qualitative opinion in my report, the financial statements of the National Youth Corps are valid for the financial position up to 31 st December 2019 and its financial performance and cash flow for the year ended 31 st December 2019 are in accordance with Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards.

1.2 The basis for the Qualified Audit opinion

(a) According to paragraph 65 of Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standard, the residual value and useful life of an asset must be reviewed at least at the end of each annual reporting period and if the expected conditions of the useful life of the asset differ from the estimates, the difference shall be reported to Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standard No. 03. The cost of Rs. 400, 719, 690 had been fully depreciated as of 31 st December 2019, even though the financial statements were revised according to the terms of the accounting standard the same was not done with respect to assets in further use. Also, as per Paragraph 65 of Accounting Standard No. 07, these assets were not properly disclosed in the financial statements.

(b) According to the financial statements as of 31st December 2019, the gratuity allocation was Rs. 22, 466, 917, but the correct gratuity allocation was Rs. 25, 644, 220, the balance of the gratuity allocation was 3,177, 303 less and the gratuity expense was Rs. 3, 177, 303 less was shown in the financial statements of the year 2019. Due to this, the deficit of the year was shown in the financial statements less than the above amount.

(c) In accordance with paragraph 21 (e) of Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standard No. 01, notes containing a summary of significant accounting policies and other descriptive notes are to be included in the financial statements, even the national youth corps should include the income, expenditure, receipts of government grants, short - term investments, payables and receivables in the financial statements, accounting policies relating to balance employee benefit allocations were not disclosed.

I conducted the audit in accordance with the Sri Lanka Audit Standards . In this report my liability under these audit standards is further elaborated in the Audit Liability for Financial statements audit. I believe that the audit evidence I have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for my qualified opinion.

1.3 . Responsibilities of the management and controlling parties in financial statements

It is the responsibility of the management to prepare and present these financial statements in accordance with the accounting standards of the Sri Lankan public sector and to determine the internal controls required to enable the preparation of financial statements without quantitative misrepresentations due to fraud or errors. In preparing the financial statements, it is the responsibility of the management to determine the continued viability of the National Youth Corps, and to disclose matters relating to the continued existence of the national youth corps, unless the management intends to liquidate the national youth corps or cease operations in the absence of any other option. It is also the responsibility of management.

Responsibility for the national youth corps' financial reporting process rests with the management parties.

In accordance with Section 16 (1) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, the national youth corps should maintain proper books and records on its own income, expenditure, assets and liabilities so as to be able to prepare annual and periodic financial statements.

1.4 Responsibility of the Auditor in relation to the auditing of financial statements

My objective as a whole is to ensure that, there is no quantitative misrepresentation of financial statements, frauds and errors, and to issue an audit report which contain my views. Fair certification is a high level of certification, but it is not always a guarantee that quantitative misrepresentations will be detected when conducting an audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Audit Standards. Fraud and error can result in quantitative misrepresentations due to individual or collective impact, and its adequacy depends on the impact on the economic decisions made by users based on these financial statements.

As part of the audit in accordance with the Sri Lanka Audit Standards, I acted with professional judgment and professional skepticism during the audit.
So I further,

- Appropriate audit procedures were designed and implemented from time to time to identify and assess the risk of quantitative misrepresentations in financial statements due to fraud or errors in formulating the basis for the published audit opinion. The impact of fraud is far greater than the impact of quantitative misrepresentations due to misconceptions, such as conspiracy, forgery, intentional evasion, misrepresentation, or evasion of internal controls.
- Although there is no intention to express an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control, an understanding of internal control was gained in order to design appropriate audit procedures from time to time.
- Appropriate accounting policies used, fairness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management were evaluated and appreciated.
- The relevance of using the national youth corps' continuity basis for accounting was determined based on the audit evidence obtained as to whether there was quantitative uncertainty about the national youth corps' continuity due to events or circumstances. If I conclude that there is sufficient uncertainty, my audit report should focus on the disclosures made in the financial statements, and if those disclosures are not sufficient, my opinion should be distorted. However, continued existence may terminate on future events or circumstances.
- The overall presentation of the financial statements, including the disclosures and events that underlie the structure and content of the financial statements, was appropriately and reasonably included and it was appreciated.
- During my audit, the governing parties were informed on important audit findings identified, key internal governance weaknesses and other issues.

2. Report on other legal and regulatory requirements

- 2.1 The National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018 contains special provisions regarding the following requirements
 - 2.1.1 In accordance with the requirements set out in Section 12 (a) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, I have obtained all the information and explanations required for the audit, except the observations made in the paragraph for the factual opinion of this report, and my examination will show that the appropriate financial records had been maintained by the national youth corps.
 - 2.1.2 The financial statements of the national youth corps were correspond with the previous year as per the requirement mentioned in Section 6 (1) (d) (iii) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018.
 - 2.1.3 The recommendations made by me during the last year as per the requirement mentioned in Section 6 (1) (d) (iv) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018 are included in the financial statements submitted.
- 2.2 In restricting the action taken and the evidence obtained and quantitative facts, none of the following statements came to my attention..
 - 2.2.1 In accordance with the requirement of Section 12 (d) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, a member of the national youth corps board of directors may be directly or indirectly involved in any agreement involving the national youth corps, outside the normal business environment.
 - 2.2.2. Acting in accordance with the requirement of Section 12 (e) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, in compliance with any relevant written law or any other general or special directive issued by the board of directors of the division except the following observations.

Directing to Rules and regulations / Commands

As per State Business Circular No. PED / 12 dated 02 nd June 2003
- Paragraph 5.1

The national youth corps had not prepared a solid plan.

- 2.2.3. The powers, duties and tasks of the national youth corps have been acted on non - compliantly as per the requirement mentioned in section 12 (g) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018.

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In compliance with the requirement of Section 12 (f) of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018, the resources of the national youth corps have not been procured and utilized in a timely manner, frugally, efficiently and effectively, in accordance with the relevant rules, except for the following observations:

2. 2. 4

(a) According to the Cabinet decision dated 09th August 2016, the construction of the Youth Corps was awarded to the National Equipment and Machinery Organization (NEMO) outside the open tender process. On the failure of construction progress, the Cabinet decision dated 20 th February 2020 to cancel these contracts, It was also approved to take legal action to recover the difference between the work done and the amount paid, to give more than 50 percent progress construction to the relevant subcontractors, and to re - tender construction progress less than 50 percent. It was observed that projects with less than 50 percent progress had not been re-tendered and the amount due from NEMO had not been calculated by 30 th May 2022.

(b) In the year 2017, ten three - wheelers were purchased at a value of Rs . 6, 650,000, and due to the delay in the construction work of the centers where the three - wheelers were proposed to be provided. They were parked in other centers. So far, due to the non - completion of the construction of the centers, they had not been started yet and the three-wheelers had been given to the provincial offices in the year 2022.

2.3

Other facts

- - - - -

(a) 6, 941 students were enrolled in the training courses conducted for the first batch of 2019 in 49 training centers out of which 4,784 students completed the course. 2, 157 or 31 percent of students had left the course of the enrolled students. 3, 882 of students were enrolled in the training courses conducted for the second batch of 2019 in 56 training centers, out of which 2, 426 students completed the course. 1, 456 or 38 percent had left the course of the enrolled students. Although the number of students who were expected to participate in ten different programs in the year 2019 in the training and development sector was 45, 510, the number of students who participated in it was 16, 727 and 28, 783 number of students did not participated. Accordingly, the percentage that did not participate in each other' s training programs ranged from 50 to 79 percent.

- (b) In the year 2019 , there were 49 coaching centers for the first batch and the classroom capacity was 7825 students. Students were registered beyond the classroom capacity for 16 training centers, while the number of students registered in 33 centers was lower than the capacity. In the year 2019, there were 56 training centers for the second batch and 3882 students were enrolled for the classroom capacity of 9105 students and the number of registered students was lower than the capacity of all the centers. Although the classroom capacity of Dambulla Hotel School is 200 students, the number of students enrolled for the first and second batch in 2019 was 103 and 97 students respectively, and although the classroom capacity of the Yakkala Business Outsourcing Institute (IBPO) is 60 students, 2019 - 1 And the number of students enrolled for 2019 - 11 groups were 37 and 08 students respectively and it was observed that the classroom capacity was underutilized.
- (c) As of 31st December 2019, the division had maintained 56 training centers locally in the lands where the centers of the youth division have been established, and 58 number of lands were related to those centers. The Sri Lanka Mahaweli Authority, Sri Lanka Board of Investment, Land Reform Commission, Ministry of Education, and National Youth Service Council had acquired vacant land and land with buildings were started training centers during the establishment of the national youth corps. Although the land acquisition of 18 centers has been completed, the land acquisition related to the remaining 26 centers has not been completed yet. A building belonging to the National Youth Service Council in Nuwara Eliya was taken over or without payment of rent, and a government school in Trincomalee was also used as a training center.
- (d) Rs.19, 538, 108 which included in other receivables of the financial statements. The receivables from the year 2015 to the year 2019 which is Rs. 11, 172,664 remained uncollected as on 31st December 2021.
- (e) Rs.61, 948, 023 which Included in the other payable value of the financial statements, liabilities payable from the year 2016 to the year 2019 amounting to Rs.13, 262, 791 remained unsettled as of 31st December 2021.
- (f) As of 19 th January 2021, the small business development division, which was an organization outside the national youth corps, had not been able to recover Rs. 13, 653, 116, which should have been charged for the assessment and related to the use of electricity and water from 2015 to 2020.

- (g) Out of the 09 vehicles used in the head office, 07 vehicles are not owned by the national youth corps, but the said vehicles were not taken over in the name of the national youth corps. Also, 03 vehicles that were taken out of service and should be disposed of had not been disposed of by 19 th January 2021.
- (h) Among the approved staff, there were 87 and 11 vacancies for Development Assistant and Management posts respectively. Further, the approved Tamil language, IT and English language instructors for the training centers of the national youth corps are 57, 59 and 58 respectively, but only 10, 39 and 35 will remain as permanent posts and 15 Tamil language instructors and 04 English language instructors were also recruited on contract basis. Accordingly, there were 32, 20 and 19 vacancies for Tamil, IT and English instructors respectively.

Report of the Auditor General in terms of Section 12 of the National Audit Act No. 19 of 2018 on the financial statements and other legal and regulatory requirements of the National Youth Corps for the year ending 31st December 2019.

1. Financial Statements

1.1 opinion

1.2 The basis for opinion

(A) Deviation from Sri Lanka Public Sector Accounting Standards

(I) I point out that musical and sports equipment worth Rs. 10, 828,772 /- has been depreciated using the training equipment depreciation rate of 20 % under property equipment and equipment. Since musical instruments and sports equipment are also included under training equipment, they have been depreciated at a rate of 20 %, and I would like to mention that relevant corrections will be made in the 2021 annual accounts.

(B) All the remittances issued by the national youth corps to the vocational training institutes will be issued a check drawn in the name of the respective institute, marked as non - negotiable and to the donor's account only. Accordingly, I kindly point out that the ownership of the remittance slip will be transferred to the relevant name only. While dealing with the national youth corps training centers and professional training institutes, the practical difficulty of doing this procedure is pointed out . But if this procedure indicated by the inquiries is corrected, every payment voucher presented in this way from the year 2022 will be certified by the recipient's signature from the relevant institution. Necessary steps have been taken by informing the centers to get it.

Directing to Rules and regulations

Observations

(A) Youth Corps Act No. 21 of 2002

(I) 2 (4)

efforts have been made to appoint officers for the National Youth Corps Council, After the appointment of a new government in November 2019. The officers of the National Youth Corps Council, which has been in place since July 2019, will resign from their posts after the appointment of a new government in November 2019. The ministry of state for sports and youth affairs, was informed about the resignations, which was the line ministry of the national youth corps at that time. In the new government which appointed on November 2019, after the national youth corps arose under the ministry of sports and youth affairs, an officer was appointed as the chairman and director of the national youth corps, but no officers were appointed for the national youth corps council. Regarding the appointment of officers for the National Youth Corps Council, the relevant appointments could not be made , although the issues were presented on several occasions in the meetings and discussions held with the honorable minister and the secretary of the ministry and other officials.

Under the new government appointed in 2020, members were appointed for the National Youth Corps Council in January 2021 after the National Youth Corps came under the Ministry of Youth and Sports in accordance to the written request regarding the appointment of the National Youth Corps Council in the discussion held with the Honorable Minister. Accordingly, the first meeting has been held on 11 st February 2021. Accordingly, I accept that the three - committees for the administration of the National Youth Corps council were not appointed.

(ii) Section 19

According to the National Youth Corps Act, there was also a plan to give them jobs after the initial training. According to this, nearly a hundred people who took the initial courses were given job opportunities in the National Youth Corps in 2003. But currently, I would like to point out that priority is given to vocational training rather than job training after basic training. And also , since the participation of trainees / beneficiaries of this age group in the groups recruited in the past periods has increased, formal professional training opportunities have also been created for them. Directing to on – the – job training have also been made under this background for the youth of this age limit. Also, according to the National Youth Policy (2014), people between the ages of 15 – 29 are identified as the youth community, and the National Youth Corps is one of the leading institutions for training the youth community in Sri Lanka. So there has been opened the training opportunities for young people between the ages of 16 and 28. Approval for this age limit has also been required in the pending National Youth Corps Authority Act before execute it.

(B) section 8 A

In the budget proposals of 2016, provision was allocated for the establishment of 100 new centers of the National Youth Corps. Accordingly, these lands were identified by the Provincial Directors of the National Youth corps with the intervention and approval of the Divisional Secretaries of each Divisional Secretariat. On the intervention of the regional and district secretaries of the lands so identified, measurement work was carried out and building construction work was carried out with the approvals and connections of the regional secretariat offices. Along with this, acquisitions were also carried out, and those acquisition are already being finalized.

(C) section 5. 4. 8

The Cabinet Memorandum No. 8 / 0173 / 344 / 002 presented by the Honorable Minister of Construction and Engineering Services on 11 th January 2008 has received Cabinet approval on 6 th February 2008. According to that decision, the National Youth Corps did not obtain the bonds from NEMO as the construction industries carried out by the State Construction Corporation and the Sri Lanka State Engineering Corporation were exempted from the requirement of providing performance and advance bonds.

(C) (i) section 6. 5. 3

The query and the 2018 financial reports also provided detailed information regarding the delay in submission of annual reports. Accordingly, annual reports related to the 03 years 2015, 2016 and 2017 were prepared and approved. It took some time to prepare these annual reports, especially since the National Youth Corps officers had no experience or experience in preparing annual reports in this regards , and the spread of the Covid - 19 virus that occurred in the year 2020 also caused some delay in these activities. However, the annual reports for the years 2015 , 2016 and 2017 were prepared and tabled in Parliament on 03. 11. 2021.

The 2018 and 2019 annual reports have also been filed and the audit reports related to those years have not been completed until now. I would like to inform you that after completing the observations of the chairman for the audit reports, those reports will be included in the annual reports and after translation for English and Tamil languages, they will be submitted to the Cabinet and approved and tabled in the Parliament as soon as possible.

(ii) section 8. 3. 9

According to the request of the President's Secretary and the approval of the Secretary of the Line Ministry to which the National Youth Corps belongs, 04 members of the National Youth Corps staff were assigned to the Presidential Secretariat and 01 person was assigned to the office of the Honorable Minister as per the approval of the Secretary of the Line Ministry. So far, 04 of them have been released back to the National Youth Corps. Thus, according to the request made from the higher headquarters and the approval of the line ministry secretary, the officers of the National Youth Corps staff have to be released to other institutions.

As well as,

I would also like to mention that these 03 three - wheelers have been given to the Small Business Development Division as per the request made by the Small Business Development Division, which is an institution under the National Youth Corps Ministry, and as per the advice and approval of the Ministry Secretary. I point out that legal confiscation of these three-wheelers has been done to the Ministries.

(iii) Section 7. 4. 1

An Audit and Management Committee of the Institute was appointed in accordance with the approval of the National Youth Corps Council and the Ministry letter dated 03 .04. 2017 regarding the holding of the Audit Committee meeting of the National Youth Corps. Under that, the audit and management committee meeting related to the 1 st quarter of 2018 was held on 25. 01. 2018. However, on several occasions after that, due to the change of ministries, changes in the composition of the National Youth Corps Council and the non - meeting of the National Youth Corps Council, I would like to mention that the audit and management committee meetings related to the next 03 quarters of 2018 have not been scheduled.

(iv) Section 5.1

with the plan to increase the National Youth Corps training centers to 100, related activities were prepared to prepare the composite plan for the coming years, but so far the Cabinet approval has been received for the National Youth Corps Authority Act. I would like to point out that further work is going on for that and a comprehensive plan is to be prepared and presented with the new Authority Act.

(D) F. R . 103 and 104

I point out that an amount of Rs. 364, 120.00 has been paid by the insurance company for the repair of vehicle accidents, which has not been paid from the National Youth Corps account. Also, I would like to further inform that since the year 2020, activities are being carried out in accordance with the Financial Regulations 103 and 104 related to vehicle accidents.

2 . 2. 4

2 . 2. 4. 1 . Principal Receipts

I would like to mention that the Rs. 13 million and Rs. 6.4 million mentioned in accordance with the above heading for starting the 3 Chinese - language labs have been used for the related activities as follows.

- 1) Galle Center - : - At present classroom arrangements have been completed.
- 2) Wennappuwa Centre - :- It is planned to obtain the cost estimate and give the same provision to the building department for further work.
- 3) Yakkala Center - :- All the Estimates have been prepared for construction and sanitary facilities are also required.
- 4) New laboratories are planned to be built at the centers of Wennappuwa and Galle.

It has been estimated that the construction work of above mentioned 3 Centers will cost approximately Rs.18 million, while the necessary equipment has been provided to the Galle Center and a list of requirements for the Wennappuwa Center has also been prepared.

2.2.4.1 Management of Vehicles

- (A) I acknowledge that the vehicles owned by the National Youth Corps Head Office are not recorded for the annual cargo survey. But since the year 2020, the goods have been surveyed and records have been recorded by correcting the mistake.
- (B) Arrangements are being made to complete the acquisition of the registration rights of 07 vehicles belonging to other institutions.
- (C) activities related to the disposal of underutilized Vehicles were completed in the year 2021
- (D) KIA bearing number KA - - 5274 owned by National Youth Corps has been referred to KIA dealership company for repair. Due to the importation of the various spare parts required for the repair from the country where the car was manufactured and the inability to import the spare parts due to the covid - 19 pandemic , the repair could not be completed promptly.

2.2.4.3 liquidize and underutilized assets

Three - wheelers were purchased in December 2017 for all the new centers to be constructed under the pilot project. On the basis of starting all these centers in the year 2018 and on the basis of the need to provide three - wheelers for all the centers that will be started, three - wheelers had to be purchased depending on the allocated funds for the project. After that, three - wheelers were also provided to the respective centers based on the priority of the newly established centers. However, I admit that due to the extreme delay in the construction work of the National Machinery Institute, the three - wheelers to be given to the centers which were to be started by the date of the audit had to be parked at the nearest center of the province to which the centers belong.

2.2.4.4 Management inefficiencies

At the beginning of the National Youth Corps, empty lands and buildings were obtained from the institutions of the Government Divisional Secretaries, Sri Lanka Mahaweli Authority, Sri Lanka Investment Board, Land Reform Commission, Ministry of Education, National Youth Service Council etc. and the National Youth Corps Training Centers were established. But the land and buildings were not formally acquired at that time. Currently, related activities are being carried out to formally conquest these lands.

So far, the land acquisition of 18 centers has been completed. Also, the Land Commissioner General has approved the land transfer of two other centers (Tanamalwila and Seruwila) and the Provincial Land Commissioner has recommended the land transfer of the other two centers and presented them to the Land Commissioner. Also, according to the acquisition proposals submitted for the acquisition of a land belonging to the Land Reform Commission, the activities related to the acquisition have almost been completed.

The land on which the National Youth Corps training centers are located will not be handed over directly to the National Youth Corps and the lands will be handed over to the line ministry to which the National Youth Corps belongs. Accordingly, the rest of the land where the training centers are located is being taken over in connection with the line ministry belonging to the National Youth Corps. However, due to the support provided by the respective regional secretaries and related institutions, and the periodic change of line ministries belonging to the national youth corps , these takeover activities have hindered.

The Muthur National Youth Corps Training Center was established in the year 2016 in a building acquired on rental basis in Muthur Divisional Secretariat of Trincomalee District under the Pilot Project of Building a National Youth Service. Later in 2020, due to the spread of the Covid - 19 virus, the arrival of trainees almost stopped, so this center, which was run on the basis of paying rent, was closed in May 2020 and the belongings of the National Youth Corps were distributed to other centers.

The Kinnia National Youth Corps Training Center in Trincomalee District is run in a part of Trinco / Kin / Al Raulah College and the Hunguranketha National Youth Corps Training Center in Nuwara Eliya District is run in a premises where a National Youth Service Council center is also located. And also, according to the instructions of the Ministry, the National Youth Corps Training Center in Haguranketha has been removed from that place and accordingly, the buildings where it was administered will be handed over to the National Youth Service Council.

The Kinnia National Youth Corps Training Center in Trincomalee District is run in a part of Trinco / Kin / Al Raulah College and the Hunguranketha National Youth Corps Training Center in Nuwara Eliya District is run in a premises where a National Youth Service Council center is also located. And also, according to the instructions of the Ministry, the National Youth Corps Training Center in Haguranketha has been removed from that place and accordingly, the buildings where it was administered will be handed over to the National Youth Service Council.

2.2.4.5

Non-implementation of Cabinet recommendations

(A)

According to AMA / 16 / 1501 / 736 / 034 and the Cabinet Memorandum dated 17 th August 2016, the contract has been awarded to the National Machinery Institute outside of the open tender process. According to the decision of the Cabinet of Ministers, those agreements were canceled due to the failure of the construction progress led by the National Machinery Institute. According to the ministerial paper, it was decided to give more than 50 % of the related constructions to the subcontractors. Accordingly, the contract was awarded to subcontractors on 28 / 12 / 2020 for the construction of 06 building units in 05 centers. And also, within the allocation limit allocated for the year 2021, 06 building units have been contracted to subcontractors this year. The building department has been notified to carry out the necessary steps to call for tenders in projects with a percentage of less than 50 %. Notices have also been given to the National Machinery Institute to provide the necessary documents to the National Youth Corps for calculating the amount due from the National Machinery Institute.

(B)

The contracts were cancelled on the recommendation of the building department due to the failure to complete the construction work within the stipulated time in the Chilaw and Kalpitiya projects, which were awarded to Sinek Engineering Private Limited, not Senek Engineering Private Limited as shown in the query. The agency has also collected the security deposit for construction from the National Youth Corps as mentioned below.

I acknowledge the delay in providing the revised payment certificate from the Building Department as mentioned in the query. But I also mention that it is difficult to present specific facts from the online youth division about the reasons that led to it. As mentioned above, the amount of work performance guarantees and advance guarantees was charged to the institution, and I point out that our institution has an amount of Rs. 1, 376, 000.00 as retentions.

2.2.4.6 Accrued expenses, payable and receivable balances

(C) The unsettled amount of Rs 546,707.64 relating to the years 2016, 2017 and 2018 has been settled by the detailed audit enquiry. (SYA / NYC / 2019 / CM / AQ - 01)

(D) It has been stated that out of the amount of Rs. 61, 948, 023 /- stated as other payable values, the values of Rs. 39, 971, 897 /- which should be settled for the years from 2016 to 2018 have not been settled. Among those values, I will quickly present a detail of the values that have been settled and the settlement of which is problematic. (SYA / NYC / 2019 / CM / AQ - 01)

(E) I point out that the receivables recorded in the financial statements for the provision of water and electricity facilities from the Small Business Development Division have been paid from the Small Business Development Division from the year 2021. But it has been mentioned that there is no provision to make payments for the early years, and arrangements have been made to discuss the next steps to be taken in this regard in the upcoming meeting of the Audit of Ministry and Management Committee.

Also, the money has been paid from the Special Task Force but has been credited to the water and electricity expense accounts on an urge, and the same has been omitted to be corrected at the time of preparing the financial reports. But I will make a note to correct it in the accounts of 2021.

(F) Although requests were made to the Ministry on several occasions to release these withheld money, written requests were made to the Ministries from time to time since 2017, but due to the change of Ministries from time to time since 2017, I admit that it was difficult to settle the relevant money. But in the year 2021, an amount of Rs 14, 144, 995.88 (Rec No 07626 on 20 / 01 / 2021) has been given from the Ministry, and it has been recovered.

Other matters

2.3.1

Operational inefficiencies

- (A) and (B) As indicated in the inquiry, in order to reduce the number of dropouts in the year 2019, the National Youth Corps will provide a certificate recognized by SIBA from the first phase of 2021 for English and IT subject, professional players through national level sports competitions and national level art competitions. And by raising the quality of the course by working to produce artists, efforts have been made to reduce the number of young men / women who drop out of the course.
- (C) 30 trainees have completed the course, Out of the 37 trainees recruited for the Yakkala IBPO training course shown in the query. The number of dropouts is 07. The dropout rate of the course module is 18%. It can also be mentioned that out of the 30 students who completed this course, 26 have been employed already. It can be shown as a percentage of 82%. It is also stated that the amount of 07 trainees who left the course were due their personal needs. This was the reason for leaving the course by trainees. Examples include linking the defense sector, seeking employment in the private sector, reluctance to settle and language problems.
- (D) 103 trainees / beneficiaries were registered for the first phase of 2019 for the National Youth Corps Dambulla Hotel Training School, and 97 trainees / beneficiaries were registered for the second phase of 2019. Since these courses are NVQ Level iii / iv courses after participating in the course, the trainees / beneficiaries must continue to participate, financial problems arise due to the distance from home, difficulty in handling the language during the course, moving to other jobs, emergency illness. These trainees / beneficiaries have left the course on the basis of reasons such as unavoidable surgeries due to the circumstances etc. And also the Muslim children leaving the course due to the Easter attack. Based on such facts, leaving the courses or further engaging in the courses were decided according to the wishes of the trainee.
- (E) Although the number of students expected to participate in 10 programs in the year 2019 is stated as 45510, the number of students participating in those programs is the same as the 5000 students targeted for the various programs of the National Youth Corps. In some programs the entire group participates, while in other programs only a select group participates based on talent. (eg - Knowledge based Q and A competitions, provincial games). And Also, due to the corrupted situation in the country (Easter attack) collective activities were limited and many of the programs planned to be held by the National Youth Corps had to be cancelled under this unexpected situation in the country. I point out that the percentage of trainees who did not participate in the programs has increased due to such kind of facts.

2.3.2 Human Resource Management

- (A) In the year 2019, the approved staff of the National Youth Corps was 981, but the actual staff was 712 and there were 269 vacancies. The reason for this is that the employees related to the positions of Information Technology, English Instructor and Development Assistant (Professional Advisor and Personality Development) in the National Youth Corps who have completed their graduation are entitled to a government pension such as teacher appointments, development officers and other appointments given by the government. There is an increased tendency to apply for positions.
- (B) According to the recruitment procedures for the posts of Station Officers (Centre Commander, Assistant Center Commander) and Provincial Officers (Assistant Director – Provinces) of the National Youth Corps, the officers who have served in the armed forces and retired or who have left legally are recruited. Accordingly, in cases where the presence of such retired or legally retired officers is not sufficient for these positions, the officers of the National Cadet Corps have been employed for those positions on a secondary basis in order to continue the activities of the respective centers. And also, I would like to mention that since the National Youth Corps does not pay salaries for the officers employed on secondary basis, there is no additional cost to the government.
- (C) Although employees are recruited for the positions of Development Assistant and Management Assistant for the National Youth Corps on a permanent basis, since the appointments obtained from the National Youth Corps are not entitled to a pension, and since the island centers have been established, they apply for the permanent pensionable jobs of the government and apply for them. There is an increasing trend of applying for those positions. Government teacher appointments, development assistants, management assistants and other various jobs and personal reasons cause a very large number of resignations every year. Therefore, one of the main reasons affecting the vacancy of the respective positions is directing to the existence of vacancies of the jobs which including the government's permanent pensions.
- (D) The post of National Youth Coordinator of the National Youth Corps is a post recruited on contract basis, no new recruitment was made as the contract period for the respective post has expired. I would like to point out that currently the relevant post has been removed from the approved staff of the National Youth Corps.
- (E) The approved staff for English, Tamil and IT subjects are 58, 57, and 59 respectively. Arrangements were made to recruit for many of the vacant posts from the approved task force, but since the appointments obtained from the National Youth Corps are not entitled to a pension, there is a greater tendency to apply for jobs that receive permanent government pensions. Also, since the centers of the National Youth Corps are established all over the island, I accept that there is a low level of reporting of counselors to duty for those areas, during the recruitment for the centers in the North and East,

(F) Necessary steps have been taken to conduct recruitment by publishing newspaper advertisements, inviting applications, conducting interviews and recruitment for the post of development assistant in the National Youth Corps. However, as the appointment obtained from the National Youth Corps does not entitle them to a pension, the youth corps staff are not entitled to the privileges and facilities enjoyed by the employees of a government, public corporation, board or statutory body, and hence such facilities are provided. National Youth Corps employees who have the opportunity to be appointed for a position in an organization regularly leave the National Youth Corps service. I admit that especially in the year 2019, when the government makes appointments for graduates as well as in the recruitment of teachers, the tendency to leave this service was high, so the employee turnover was high in the year.

2.3.3 Receivables

Since the line ministry that belongs to the Small Business Development Division and the National Youth Corps was one, that department as well as the line ministry have informed about the values to be charged from that institution for the respective years. As a result, the Small Business Development Division has allowed the expenses for water and electricity consumption in relation to the year 2021, and once again a written awareness was made about the steps taken for the values for the previous years, including the query.

2.3.4 Classroom capacity

(A) According to the facilities available in the centers and the location of the centers in the recruitment of youths for the National Youth Corps Training Centers, there is a high demand among the youths for certain centers. Therefore, I would like to point out that recruitment has been done beyond the capacity of some centers, based on the existing demand for each center.

(B) Trainees/Beneficiaries are recruited for the Dambulla Hotel Training School only after completing the National Youth Corps Basic Training. Accordingly, even though the number of trainees / beneficiaries who can be trained is 200. After completing the basic training and applying for vocational training, the trainees / beneficiaries will be referred for vocational training based on their wishes. In the year 2019, only those who completed the National Youth Corps basic course were recruited for hotel training courses, and there was a problem in providing accommodation to them. So that some problems had arisen to achieve the desired goal. Furthermore, the decline in the hotel sector with the Easter attack in 2019 was another reason for the reduction of trainees / beneficiaries joining the course.




